Course Description

This course covers the basic practice and theory of drawing with color and monochromatic media.

Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Exhibit a basic working knowledge of fundamental techniques in the following media: pencil, pencil crayon, conté and ink.
- Utilize the Elements of Art (line, shape, value and texture) and the Principles of Organization (harmony and variety).
- Explore means of representation based on visual observation that utilizes a variety of techniques.
- Begin to explore means of abstraction, content and personal interpretations.
- Develop critical evaluation skills.

Course Schedule

The following are the subjects that will be covered. Each of the subjects will have a short introductory lecture, related studio project and critique.

- Introduction to color media. Discussion of color and value relationships.
- Strategies and manipulation of color media through a variety of still life and real life drawings.
- Development of subjective and objective drawing strategies.
- Development of abstraction.
- · Continuation of figure drawing, proportions, sighting and foreshortening
- Master's Drawing study.
