Course Description and Structure

A supervised practical experience with a community or social agency related to the student's interest and/or future plans. Readings, written assignments and group meetings will help students reflect on and integrate knowledge with practical experience.

Course Objectives

1. Students are to volunteer 3- 5 hours per week over a 10 week period
2. Establish learning and personal goals for supervised practicum experience
3. Begin to integrate theoretical issues in psychology and sociology with practical knowledge
4. Gain valuable work experience

Course Requirements

1. Written Assignments (35%) (Due November 26th)
 - η Students will write a five-page paper that applies 2 relevant theoretical and/ or methodological issues to their practicum experiences. You will be marked along the dimensions set out in the written assignment evaluation sheet. Please attach this sheet to your final copy of your paper before it is

- handed in for marking.
2. Completed Evaluate Form by Practicum Supervisor (35%) (Due December 2nd). This mark will be based completely on the mark provided to you by your practicum supervisor
 3. Participation in Class Discussions – Each student should come prepared, having read the assigned chapter(s) and ready to discuss reflections on the related material. (10%)
 4. Self-Evaluation Form and Journal (20%) (Due December 3rd)
 - η Your journal should contain a record of your volunteering activities and personal experiences. This will include your reactions to events in a manner that is critically reflective and exploratory in nature. As well, in class and out of class exercises should be included in your journal. This means that your journal will have to be present with you in classes;)
