What Jesus Thinks About...: Research what Jesus thinks about the assigned issue using the synoptics as your only sources. Use a concordance to find all the material in the synoptic gospels that pertain to your topic. Summarize and communicate as clearly as possible what your reading of the gospel evidence yields about Jesus' opinions on the subject. Write up your results in a 2-3 page double spaced paper. In an end note, indicate every passage you looked at in your research. The paper should include only your analysis, not quotations from the Bible. You will want to include references to a passage in parentheses at points, e.g. (Mk 12.45). The paper is due at the beginning of the class, Sept. 17, Oct. 1, Oct. 10.

Research Paper This is an opportunity to pick a topic about Jesus you want to explore and do a research paper. 10-12 pages, type written, double spaced. Minimum 10 sources, include at least four journals.

Final Exam The final exam will be an essay type with three questions. One from Witherington, *The Jesus Quest;* one from Miller, *Jesus at Thrity;* and the third question will be the simple question "Who was Jesus?"
