## Course Objectives

The apostle Paul unquestionably stands as one of the most important figures in the history of the Christian church. All of us today are deeply indebted to the man who pioneered and championed the revolutionary gospel mission to the Gentiles, as well as the writer who has given us thirteen of the twenty-seven books in our New Testament. This course is designed to study the life of the zealous Pharisee who was miraculously encountered by the risen Christ and called to proclaim the gospel to the Gentiles. We will rely upon the Acts narrative (chaps. 9-28) and the few autobiographical moments in Paul's letters in order to trace out his life as believer, missionary, and pastor. In the Fall term we will follow Paul from his conversion and call through his missionary journeys, his arrest and trials, his Roman imprisonment, and conclude with a possible reconstruction of his final years, thereby establishing the historical settings for his letters. In the Winter term we will study Paul's letters and theology.
