COURSE SYLLABUS

DESCRIPTION:

An intense and comprehensive study of the principals and practices of local church youth ministry. Methodological framework will focus on three distinct skill levels: working with 1) teens themselves, 2) adult volunteers and parents, 3) managing supervising volunteers and/or interns, as well as working along side other church staff members. Special focus throughout will be on the personal life of the youth worker, and the nurture of spiritual life necessary to engage in Christian ministry.

RELEVANCE FOR MINISTRY/COURSE OUTCOMES:

The anticipated outcomes of this course are that learners will:

- a) know and understand basic principles of youth ministry in the local church.
- b) assess their own skill level strengths and weaknesses.
- c) select a project relevant to their current or projected youth ministry involvement.
- d) identify personal and ministry hazards with a view to building fences against failure.
- e) encouragement and affirmation in working with young people to accomplish great goals in God's power.

ASSIGNMENTS:

- 1. **Interview a full time youth minister** on how he/she maintains his/her own spiritual development. Prepare a 2-3 minute synopsis of this interview for oral presentation in class. 5%
- 2. Write a 6-8 page paper. 40% Carefully reference material you incorporate from various resource. Choose from the following practical application options or obtain permission from instructor for your own:
- a) Prepare a detailed outline for four 45 minute sessions that will orient and prepare adult volunteers to work in your church's youth ministry program.
- b) Prepare a detailed outline for four 45 minute "peer ministry" training sessions to be used with your youth leadership team.
- c) Prepare a detailed outline for a summer youth weekend retreat including purpose, schedule, budget, staff orientation, and program notes.
- d) A practical application project of your own choosing.
- 3. On the book (seminary, two books) of your choosing prepare the following report: 35% a) a one paragraph journal type entry for each chapter stating your own reaction or thinking about the chapter.
- b) After reading the entire book, look back through your journal entries...which two chapters do you feel will be the most helpful in your future ministry and why?
- 4. Reading assigned texts (Borthwick and Fields). Prepare a one page "most helpful chapter" paper on each. 10%

5. Write a 3-4 page paper reflecting on the Kageler text. Pick three or four ideas in the text and illustrate how you have seen this to be true (or not true) in your own experience. 10%
