- 2. Write a 3-4 page reflection paper on the book
- 3. Practical application & report take one of the spiritual disciplines' and do a practical application of this discipline over a week-end. Prepare a report, recording when the spiritual discipline was implemented, how long, and the

reason why you chose the discipline, what you learned from the experience and how you might implement it into your life. Report length 2-3 pages.

All material submitted must be typed and double-spaced.
