Course Description:

This course is an introduction to counseling theory and skills with particular emphasis on Chinese pastoral counseling. This includes an introduction to theological and psychological foundations and to issues of integration. A major focus is on skill development. Secular and Christian approaches will be presented and critiqued with a view to implications for Christian counseling. Application will be made to problem management, opportunity development, and spiritual mentoring. This course is taught in Cantonese.

Besides teaching, he is also an individual, marriage and family therapist part time, as well as serving as a pastor at North Point Alliance Church. Dr. Lee writes weekly in two different newspaper columns and published over 10 books over the last 5 years. His recent publications include《逆境中的心靈探索與導引》.《靈 程歷奇》.《心靈輔導 - 心理輔導與屬靈導引的整合》.《沿路有你 - 屬靈生命指引》.
