## **Course Objectives**

- 1. Students will be able to explain selected historical themes affecting the Christian and Missionary Alliance from the late nineteenth century to the present.
- 2. Students will have an interpretive grid for analysing the history of the Christian and Missionary Alliance through its central continuities and changes.
- 3. Students will be able to identify the Alliance distinctives which have shaped its historical and doctrinal experience. Particular attention will be paid to sanctification, healing, eschatology, and missions.
- 4. Students will have a broadened understanding of the work of the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada and throughout the world.

## **Course Requirements**

#### Participation (10%)

Each student is expected to attend, be prepared for and to **participate** in each class session. This is reflected in the percentage of the final mark assigned to participation. To be credited for one's class attendance, the student must be present for and suitably

participate in the *whole* class session. (This latter policy applies to both the participation portion of the final grade as well as the larger attendance policy outlined in the latest College catalogue.)

## **Critical Book Reviews (50%)**

In addition, each student will write **two critical book reviews**. Books for review are in the list provided at the end of this syllabus. Each review will assess the **three** books from the subject area designated. The second review must assess books from a wholly different subject area than the first. Reviews should focus on 1) the central and supporting theses of each text and 2) the points of agreement and disparity between the two. Reviews are to be no longer than 5 pages (approx. 1,250 words) and are **due October 18** and **November 15.** 

#### Final Exam (40%)

The final exam will focus on two major areas. First, the student will be examined on their ability to identify significant persons, places, events and dates described in the class lectures and the assigned text, *Rebirth*. Second, the student will be examined on their ability to identify, explain and synthesize the material covered in class lectures, discussions and supplementary reading. This exam will occur during "Finals Week" on a date and time to be determined by the Registrar's office.

#### **General Information**

All assignments are due *at the beginning of class* on the date designated. Late assignments will lose one-half letter grade per day (weekends included) up to one week. Work received more than one week late will not receive a passing grade.
