PREACHING IN A POSTMODERN WORLD (PR 645-M) Canadian Theological Seminary May 9-13, 2005, Calgary, AB Instructor: Peter Ralph ThM., D.Min.

#### 1. DESCRIPTION

This course will examine the varied realities of preaching to a postmodern audience. The course includes emphasis on narrative and inductive preaching, with applications to topical preaching and evangelistic methods in preaching. The course assumes that students bring to the course an understanding of basic techniques such as hermeneutics, exegesis, basic deductive sermon structure, illustration, application, introductions, conclusions, and transitions.

Students should expect to prepare and present or discuss daily assignments prepared outside of class hours. In addition, students may be asked to scan the media and present insights which may influence the way we preach.

#### 4. **REQUIREMENTS**

- a. **Attendance** at all class sessions is required. All students are expected to participate in class activity and discussion.
- **b. Reading**: Daily portions of the text chosen by instructor and student are to be read carefully and completely. Students will come to class prepared to discuss each daily section. In addition students will select material from other books on postmodern preaching from the reserve list or other sources for a total of not less than 800 pages overall. A record of this reading is to be submitted in the form of a reading report which, in 5-7 pages, assesses the impact of the reading on the student, describing how the reading has changed the student's preaching. **Due: July 15, 2005**
- c. **Sermon**: The student will prepare, preach, record and submit one sermon. This sermon will use the methods taught in class sessions. It may be inductive or narrative in nature. This sermon is to be submitted to the instructor for evaluation. This submission will consist of:
  - (1) Typewritten exegesis, hermeneutical, and homiletical notes. (Examples of such work will be presented in class.)

- (2) One-page sermon outline.
- (3) video recording of the preaching of the sermon
- (4) Report on interview with selected listeners.

### Due: July 15, 2005

d. **Preaching**: The sermon will not exceed 20 minutes duration. This preaching assignment will be done by the student after the course in a chosen setting, with a postmodern listening audience, videotaped, and submitted in video and written format to the professor for grading.

e. **Paper**: Students will prepare a paper of not less than ten pages in length. This paper will describe in "thick description" the audience for the sermon above, demonstrating why and how they are postmodern in their orientation. Guidelines for this description will be given in class.

#### Due: July 15, 2005

- f. **Class Participation**: Students may be asked to prepare and deliver brief class assignments which reflect class material.
- g. Assignments. All work will be submitted in typewritten form. Exegetical, hermeneutical, and homiletical notes should not exceed ten pages in total length.
- h. Grading: The course will be graded as follows:
