#### **Course Description**

English 240 offers an introduction to the major genres of children's literature: folktales, hero tales, myths, literary folktales, fantastic and realistic prose fiction, to name the key forms. The course aims at providing the student with a critical method of reading and interpreting children's literature. In addition, to aid in our consideration of the major themes and issues at work in children's literature we will examine historical and current concepts of the child and childhood.
